Audio 6 - No Housing Strategy

We still don't have an actual housing strategy and we still don't have the kind of supportive housing we need. You know it's kind of... I'm doing the evaluation of Edmond's Place and kind of telling that a lot of the people living at Edmond's Place are like older you know? For many of those people, Edmond's Place represents the very first really housing, the first real housing with the potential to become a home that they have ever experienced in their whole lives. Which is absolute fucking madness. If you consider, you know, that it takes you till your mid 40s to get a place like Edmond's Place to live in, well what's happening to you in 20s and in your 30s? Something that's not really good, I'm sure. And something that's not gonna serve you well or you know, the community well if it's allowed to continue... so that's the first thing.
